April is a busy month on the allotments.

Tasks include tidying up plots, soil preparation, weed removal and sowing of seeds. Whilst undertaking these and other jobs please think about the environment and the wildlife on the sites:

HELP THE PLANET - REPAIR, REUSE, RECYCLE!

In July 2023, the Town Council declared a Climate Emergency, in response to current thinking about the changing climate and how this will affect everyone. The Council is committed to reducing Hertford's carbon footprint, with the help of residents.

One brilliant way to do this is by reducing the amount of waste we produce – this diminishes the need for raw materials, saves energy and fossil fuels, and diverts materials away from landfills and incinerators.

Five tips to reduce waste

- 1. **Compost!** Lots of advice on how to compost garden waste from the Royal Horticultural Society here: Composting / RHS Gardening. You can even use old plant waste on your paths!
- 2. **Make something new from something old** can you reuse that old bucket as a plant pot? Or use that apple tree pruning to make hedging or plant supports?
- 3. **Advertise** usable items you don't need on your Allotment Social Media group or noticeboard, or Freecycle.
- 4. **Repair rather than replace** consider taking items to Hertford Heath's Repair shop or setting up your own.
- 5. **Make weed soup fertiliser**: fill a bucket with water and weeds not suitable for compost. Cover and leave to rot down into a 'weed soup'. This works particularly well for tough weeds such as brambles. Once rotted down, use the rich liquid fertiliser for your crops or to add to compost.
